

## Central Texas College and Virginia State University Articulation Agreement

#### Introduction

This Articulation Agreement recognizes that the Central Texas College District (CTC) and the Virginia State University (VSU) are active educational partners committed to providing greater educational opportunities and services for students transferring between institutions. This agreement supports the concept of a seamless transfer embracing the principle that transfer students should not be required to repeat competencies already achieved. CTC and the Virginia State University enter into this agreement in the spirit of cooperation and mutually recognize each other as quality institutions of higher learning.

#### **Purpose**

The purpose of the agreement is to enable CTC students who transfer to Virginia State University to carry with them the credit they have already earned for as much relevant study as possible. The agreement provides a structure through which transfer articulation on all levels can be supported. The Virginia State University understands and agrees that transfer articulation is with CTC as a whole and not with individual campuses within the district. Courses taken at any CTC location and by any delivery method are considered equally transferable.

#### **Terms and Conditions**

- 1- This agreement becomes effective upon signing by both institutions and shall remain effective until one or both institutions deem it necessary to terminate the agreement. Either partner may terminate this agreement upon 90 days written notice to the other partner.
- 2- This agreement will be reviewed every two years by both institutions and any amendments must be proposed in writing.
- 3- The Appendix of the agreement that contains the crosswalk may be amended as necessary to ensure currency.
- 4- Both institutions will designate an individual who will be responsible for the maintenance of the agreement.

- 5- CTC students who desire to transfer to the Virginia State University must meet the same standards and criteria for admission to a major degree sequence as a native Virginia State University student.
- 6- The Virginia State University will encourage CTC transfer students to complete the appropriate Associate's Degree either before matriculation to the Virginia State University or by reverse transfer of course credit following admission to and attendance at the Virginia State University. The Virginia State University will develop a reverse transfer credit process that includes the methodology to notify students after they have completed at least 90 semester credit hours or 15 hours at the transfer institution.
- 7- The Virginia State University agrees to share data at least annually. These data will be related to CTC transfer students. These data include but are not limited to: number of transfer students, aggregate grades, degrees awarded, date enrolled and date graduated, etc. Both institutions agree to follow all Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) regulations or requirements to ensure confidentiality.
- 8- The Virginia State University agrees to provide transfer students with information regarding the availability of transfer scholarships for eligible students as well as any other financial aid opportunities at the Virginia State University.
- 9- CTC agrees to inform students who are nearing graduation of transfer opportunities and what needs to be accomplished to meet transfer requirements.
- 10- The Virginia State University and CTC agree to cooperate in communicating information about this agreement. Each institution will: assume responsibility for appropriate marketing to reach their respective student populations, will designate a marketing point of contact, and will annually review marketing materials to ensure currency.
- 11- CTC agrees to invite the Virginia State University to all campus transfer fairs and other applicable campus-wide events, etc. The Transfer Counselors will issue the invitation.
- 12- CTC agrees to post the transfer information from the Virginia State University on CTC's web site.

#### Virginia State University Information

Virginia State University was founded on March 6, 1882, when the Virginia legislature passed a bill to charter the Virginia Normal and Collegiate Institute. The bill was sponsored by Delegate Alfred W. Harris, a Black attorney whose offices were in Petersburg, but who lived in and represented Dinwiddie County in the General Assembly. A hostile lawsuit delayed opening day for nineteen months, until October 1, 1883. In 1902, the legislature revised the charter act to curtail the collegiate program and to change the name to Virginia Normal and Industrial Institute. In 1920, the land- grant program for Blacks was moved from a private school, Hampton Institute, where it had been since 1872, to Virginia Normal and Industrial Institute. In 1923 the college program was restored, and the name was changed to Virginia State College for Negroes in 1930. The two-year branch in Norfolk was added to the college in 1944; the Norfolk division became a four-year branch in 1956 and gained independence as Norfolk State College in 1969. Meanwhile, the parent school was renamed Virginia State College in 1946. Finally, the legislature passed a law in 1979 to provide the present name, Virginia State University.

Virginia State University, America's first fully state supported four-year institution of higher learning for Blacks is a comprehensive university and one of two land-grant institutions in the Commonwealth of Virginia. Its mission is to promote and sustain academic programs that integrate instruction, research, and extension/public service in a design most responsive to the needs and endeavors of individuals and groups within its scope of influence.

Virginia State University is dedicated to the promotion of knowledgeable, perceptive, and humane citizens secure of their self-awareness, equipped for personal fulfillment, sensitive to the needs and aspirations of others, and committed to assuming productive roles in a challenging and ever-changing global society. VSU operates on the following seven principles:

—Regardful of its heritage and its tradition of eminent concern for the education, welfare, and progress of all peoples, the University welcomes and extends its resources to all who strive for academic excellence. The University seeks to fulfill its mission by enrolling students with a diverse range of talents and abilities, including: (a) students whose pre-college records reveal high academic achievement and talent, (b) students who through a combination of have demonstrated the potential to be successful in college, and (c) students whose secondary school records reveal potential but who need special academic enhancement.

The University is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC), and the Accreditation Commission for Programs in Hospitality Administration (ACPHA).

This articulation agreement has been developed within the framework of the Virginia State Policy on Transfer (<a href="http://www.schev.edu/students/StatePolicyOnTransfer.pdf">http://www.schev.edu/students/StatePolicyOnTransfer.pdf</a>) to facilitate the transfer of credits earned by students with Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.) degrees in Hotel Management /Restaurant and Culinary Management /Culinary Arts/Food and Beverage Management at Central Texas College (CTC) into the Bachelor of Science (B.S.) degree program in Hospitality Management at Virginia State University. It is intended to provide students enrolled in the Hotel Management /Restaurant and Culinary Management /Culinary Arts/Food and Beverage Management A.A.S. program at Central Texas College admission into the B.S. in Hospitality Management at Virginia State University.

#### **Transfer Information**

Those who matriculate to the University are required to demonstrate a broad understanding of and competency in the arts and sciences and a commitment to intellectual development and scholarship in their fields of study. The University assures its constituencies of collegial participation in decision making.

<u>Admission Requirements</u>: Students who intend to transfer to VSU under the terms of this agreement must complete the *Letter of Interest* after completing (at least) 15 credits at CTC and send it to the Office of Transfer Admissions, Virginia State University, I Hayden Drive, Petersburg VA, 23806. Students who complete the *Letter of Interest* will be contacted

periodically by a VSU representative with important information to ensure a successful transfer to VSU. The Degree proposed for articulation to the University is toward a BS Hospitality Management.

Virginia State University guarantees admission into its B.S. in Hospitality Management with junior standing to those students in the CTC Associate of Applied Science Degree in Hotel Management /Restaurant and Culinary Management /Culinary Arts/Food and Beverage Management and who have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale and no individual grade lower than "C." The maximum number of lower division credits accepted in transfer is 60 semester credit hours.

VSU will consider CTC students who have not completed the Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree for admission into its B.S. programs. However, the course equivalencies as stated in the Hospitality Management Transfer Program Table are based on the completion of the AAS degree program prior to transfer. Course credit cannot be given for transfer courses in which the student earned below a "C" grade. Students who transfer prior to the completion of the associate degree program will have their courses evaluated individually per the VSU/CTC Transfer Guide. Therefore, students are encouraged to complete the Associate of Applied Science degree prior to matriculating to VSU. CTC will provide information about this program to students. The program will be promoted as the "Hospitality Management Associate of Applied Science Transfer Degree Program" in the CTC catalog, website and other publicity material. Representatives of CTC and VSU will call attention to this articulation agreement when advising students.

**Data Exchange** 

The data exchange contributes to the maintenance and improvement of articulation agreements and promotes effective cooperation between the two institutions. Students can transfer credits back to CTC from VSU. This process will be guided by the VSU's guidelines.

**Student Support Services** 

CTC will invite VSU, at their own expense, to attend college sponsored transfer events held at the college for prospective transfer students. A representative of the university, preferably from the specified department will attend CTC invited event as needed.

All students declaring HMGT as their major, including CTC Transfer students VSU HMGT students are eligible for all Industry scholarships available to all Hospitality students based upon stated criteria.
