Mrs. Mary Hatwood Futrell is the Dean of the Graduate School of Education and Human Development at George Washington University in Washington, DC, where she has served since 1995. She is also a Professor of Education and Director of George Washington's Institute for Curriculum, Standards, and Technology, as well as, the President of Education International. She is the former President of the National Education Association (NEA). Mrs. Futrell is an international speaker, lecturer, activist, and author. She has served on numerous boards, including Phi Delta Kappan, the Institute for Educational Leadership, the Kettering Foundation, the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching, and the World Confederation of Organization of the Teaching Profession.
