President Makola M. Abdullah, Ph.D.

Makola M. Abdullah, Ph.D., became the 14th President of Virginia State University (VSU) on February 1, 2016, aiming to rejuvenate the Commonwealth's sole historically black landgrant university. In 2016, the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) renewed the University's full accreditation under his leadership on June 16. Embracing Our Opportunity for Excellence, Abdullah emphasizes sustaining VSU as an 1890 University by providing transformative student experiences, strategically investing in academic programs, partnering to tell the story, embracing our

top Land-Grant status, and embracing our role as Virginia's Opportunity University.

Didactic administrator Abdullah strives for perfection. He is an internationally famous educator known for his research. In his career, African Americans have increased in STEM fields, four Ph.D.'s and six M.S.s have graduated, and over \$20 million in funding from federal agencies like the National Science Foundation, NASA, Boeing, and FEMA has been secured, with over \$5 million given as a single Principle Investigator.

He supports historically black colleges and land-grant institutions. Before becoming president, he held positions as provost and senior vice president at Bethune-Cookman University (2013-2016), provost and vice president for academic affairs at Florida Memorial University (2011-2013), and dean and director of 1890 land grant programs at Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University (2008-2011). He is viewed as an educator and forward thinker who values his presidency and relies on alumni to recruit and guide new Trojans towards academic greatness.

President Abdullah, a Chicago native, is the youngest African American to hold Ph.D. and master's degrees from Northwestern University, as well as an undergraduate degree in civil engineering from Howard University. He belongs to Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. and the 5000 Role Models of Excellence. He and his wife, Ahkinyala Cobb-Abdullah, Ph.D., are proud parents of two HBCU graduates, Mikaili and Sefiyetu.

Dr. Erebholo earned his Ph.D. in Mathematics from Howard University, with a research focus on longitudinal binary data analysis with incomplete datasets. He also holds an M.A. in Mathematics—Collegiate Teaching from Central Michigan University and an M.Sc. in Mathematics from the University of Ilorin, Nigeria.

His research spans longitudinal data analysis, logistic regression, missing data methodologies, and error analysis in numerical integration for partial differential equations. He has published widely in peer-reviewed journals and presented at numerous national conferences. His scholarship includes impactful studies on nonlinear Riccati equations, STEM retention among HBCU freshmen, and strategies to improve precalculus outcomes.

Dr. Erebholo has led several federally funded initiatives, including NIH-supported HU-ChEM and HU-URISE, aimed at strengthening biomedical research pipelines and STEM retention at HBCUs. A committed mentor and advocate, he supports faculty and student development through collaborative research, workshops, and efforts to increase diversity in biostatistics and STEM education.

Emmanuel O. Omojokun

Dean and Professor Reginald F. Lewis College of Business Virginia State University



Dr. Emmanuel Omojokun serves as the Dean of the Reginald F. Lewis College of Business (RFLCB) from 2014 to present. He established the Center for Entrepreneurship in 2015 where students and small business as well as individuals in the community are trained to become entrepreneurs and receive support including developing business plans and on securing funding for their businesses. He has led the faculty and staff of RFLCB to two successful reaccreditations by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB), International. Less than 5% of world's Business schools earn this hallmark of excellence. Under the leadership of Dr. Omojokun, the College of Business received several awards – most notable are in 2017 when HBCU Digest awarded "The Best Business Program Among HBCUs" to the College; and due to the incredible work of the Center for Entrepreneurship, AACSB awarded the College "The Innovation that Inspire" in spring 2025.

Dr. Omojokun is very passionate about Student Success and in 2019, he established the "RFLCB Student Success Support Fund." The fund provides scholarships and emergency financial support to students. Contributions of Dr. Omojokun to Virginia State University is supreme. Selected contributions include the following:

- He designed the first network on campus and selected all network devices servers, network switches, routers, firewall, workstations, server operating systems and E-mail software. When all network devices and software arrived, he invited two of his colleagues (Dr. Adeyemi Adekoya and Dr. Fidelis Ikem) to work with him on the network implementation for 3 weeks. Dr. Omojokun setup a Fiber Hub in Singleton Hall, invited Fiber Optic Cable company to connect selected buildings on campus to the fiber hub. He then connected the campus-wide network and the router to the Internet.
- He developed the first website on campus.
- He was solely responsible for establishing the Computer Science Program at VSU developing the
 curriculum, got it approved by the University and by SCHEV while serving as VSU's SCHEV
 Liaison. He taught the courses for one year before handing over the program to the School of
 Natural Sciences because his Dean would not allow him to move from the School of Business.
- He was voted for, and served multiple years as Faculty Representative on the VSU Board of Visitors. He was deemed the first representative who collected faculty accomplishments and presented them to the Board.

Dr. Omojokun has published many peer-reviewed journal articles and peer-reviewed proceedings. He was the Principal Investigator – partnering with Computer Science Corporation and three other HBCUs and developed a successful \$20m research proposal that was funded by the Department of Defense in 1992/93 year. He has received numerous awards at VSU and in his discipline. He has received several funded research grants from U.S. Army, Department of Defense, and participated in joint research grants with University of Virginia.

Dr. Omojokun earned a B.Sc. (Honors) in Mathematics with first class honors (summa cum laude) in 1974 from the Premier Nigerian University of Ibadan. He obtained his M.S. in Computer Science from University of Waterloo, Ontario, Canada; and his Ph.D. in Computer Science from the University of Colorado, Boulder Colorado. He is married to his beautiful wife and they have five successful children and nine grandchildren.
