## **POLICY 5902: BUILDING PERMITS FOR TEMPORARY STRUCTURES**

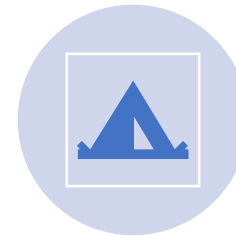

### Purpose:

Outlines the procedures for building permit application and approval process for tents, canopies, stages, bleachers, pyrotechnics, fireworks, special effects, amusement devices, and other temporary structures to be placed on university property.

## Temporary Structures Definition:



**STRUCTURES:** TENTS, STAGES, PLATFORMS, CANOPIES, BLEACHERS, GRANDSTANDS, AMUSEMENT DEVICES & OTHER STRUCTURES.



**TEMPORARY:** UTILIZED FOR 180 DAYS OR LESS.



**REQUIRES APPROVAL THROUGH AN ESTABLISHED DGS, DIVISION OF ENGINEERING BUILDINGS PERMITTING PROCEDURE.**

## Authority:

- Requests - The Director for Capital Outlay
- Permits – The Director of DEB

## Requesting Temporary Permits:

- Submit a permit application to Capital Outlay at least **10 days** prior to assembly of the structure.
- Upon review and approval, a Temporary Certificate Use Permit will be issued by the Department of Engineering & Buildings (DEB) and inspected by the Fire Marshal.
- Post the temporary certificate in open view near the structure.

## Permit Exceptions:

- Platforms (Dance Floors): **No more than 4 inches** above the grade plane at any point.
- Stage (Performance Sets): Performance sets owned by contract performance groups (e.g. private bands and theater groups - not rented locally).



## Tent Permit Requirements:

- Tent Inspection Checklist
- Larger than 30'x30' or 50 occupants.
- All information must be **submitted 10 days prior to event:**
  1. Tent Permit Request
  2. Site Layout Plan
  3. Location (show proximity to adjacent structures)
  4. Floor Plan (means of egress, aisles, exits, furniture)
  5. Other Construction (method of tie-down/anchorage, wind loads)
  6. Certificate of Flame Insurance
  7. Inspection Certificate
  8. Special Conditions
  9. Request for Excavation Permit (this includes ground stakes for tents and amusement devices).

## Stage/Platform/Bleacher Permit Requirements:

- Temporary Platform checklist
- All information must be **submitted 10 days prior to event:**
  1. Stage/Platform/Bleacher Permit Request
  2. Site Layout Plan
  3. Other Construction (means of egress, aisles, exits, guardrails, handrails, etc).
  4. Inspection Certificate
  5. Liability Insurance
  6. Closed vs Engineered Systems (provide manufacturer data, erection documents signed by Virginia licensed architect or engineer).



### CHECKLIST FOR TENTS, PLATFORMS, AND AMUSEMENT DEVICES

#### TENT

☐ Site Plan

Indicate property lines, roads, sidewalks, grades greater than 5%, distance to adjacent buildings or structures, and handicapped accessible route to the public way.

☐ Location

Show the location of the tent on the Site Plan and indicate the distances to the nearest buildings on the Permit Application. Tents proposed to be located closer to existing buildings than allowed by the USBC will require special evaluation and may require special conditions if allowed to be erected. Erection of a tent in proximity to a building shall be done in a manner which will not decrease the safety of the building occupants while providing required safety for the occupants of the Tent.

☐ Floor Plan

Indicate means of egress, aisles, exits, furnishings, and equipment. Provide a description of the function or activity to take place. Indicate the proposed Maximum Occupant Load.

☐ Other Construction

Indicate the method of tie-down / anchorage for tents including the proposed wind and live loads. (See Special Conditions below.) Indicate means of egress lighting and power for tents that are proposed to be used at night. Indicate the method of ventilation when tent sidewalls are closed, or when tents are proposed to be conditioned.

☐ Certificate of Flame Resistance

Provide Certificate of Flame Resistance to include tent serial numbers and descriptions (size, color, etc.) so that the tent certificates and tents can be clearly matched up on a one to one correspondence. Open flames, space heaters, or food cooking / heating devices (except with approved electrical appliances and approved power supply) are NOT permitted under and within 20 feet of a tent.

☐ Inspection

The Office of Emergency Management and Safety shall inspect the installation for compliance with the approved documents.

☐ Special Conditions

Tents that are proposed to be occupied during wind speeds that exceed 35 MPH require a tie down/anchorage design signed and sealed by a Virginia licensed architect or engineer.

## Amusement Devices Permit Requirements:

- Inflatable Amusement Device Checklist
- Users and Vendors will adhere to the Virginia Amusement Device Regulations when constructing or operating applicable equipment.
- All information must be submitted 10 days prior to event:
  1. Amusement Device Permit Request
  2. Site Layout Plan
  3. Inspection Certificate from Third Party Licensed Inspector
  4. Liability Insurance
  5. Request for Excavation Permit (this includes ground stakes for tents and amusement devices).



## Fireworks Permit Requirements:

- Approval for the display of fireworks on VSU property must be obtained by State Fire Marshal's Office (SMFO) by obtaining a permit.
- Coordination with campus security is required to assure notification of all emergency services agencies.
- All information must be submitted 30 days prior to event:
  1. SMFO Permit
  2. Inspection Certificate
  3. Liability Insurance



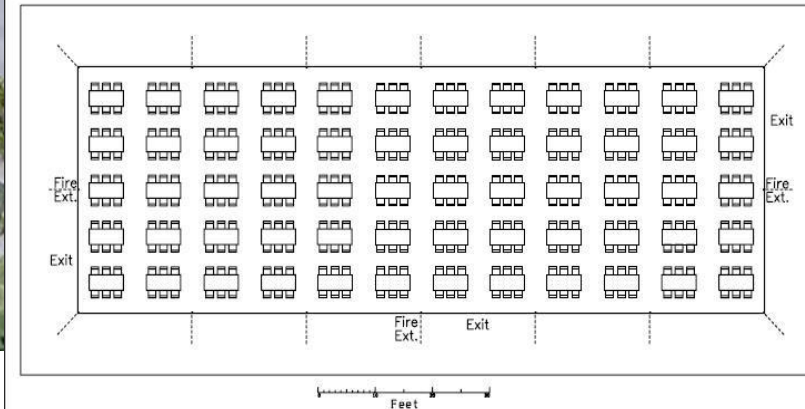
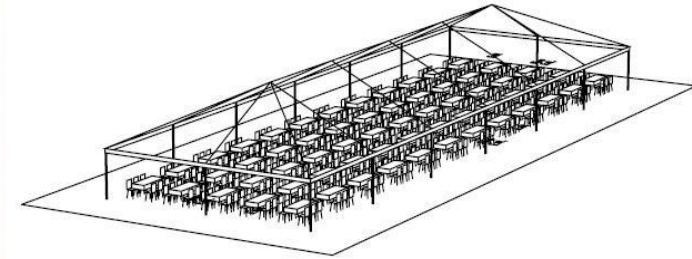
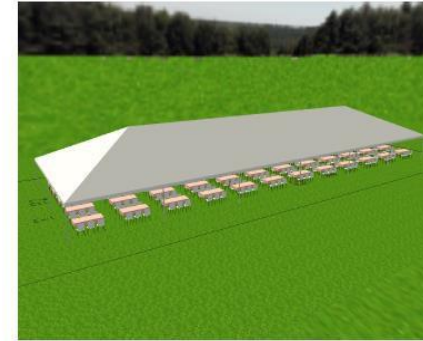
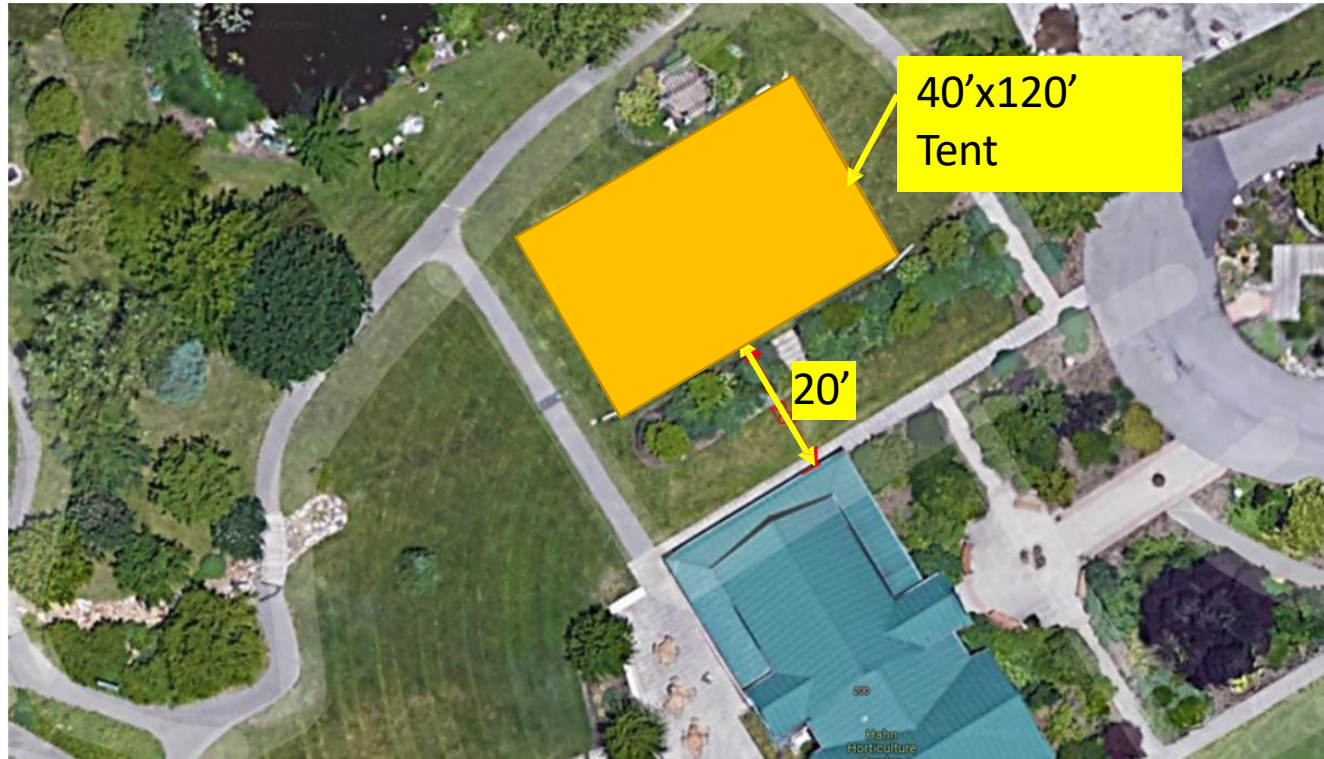
## Open Flames (Indoor) and Open Burning (Outdoors) Permit Requirements:

- Prohibited indoors
- Approval must be obtained by VSU Safety Department and may also require **approval by the Virginia State Fire Marshal's Office (SMFO) by obtaining a permit.**
- **Open Burning use under tent is prohibited.** This includes food prep use (fryer, grill, etc.).
- All information must be submitted 10 working days prior to event:
  1. Open Burning Permit Request
  2. Inspection Certificate
  3. Liability Insurance





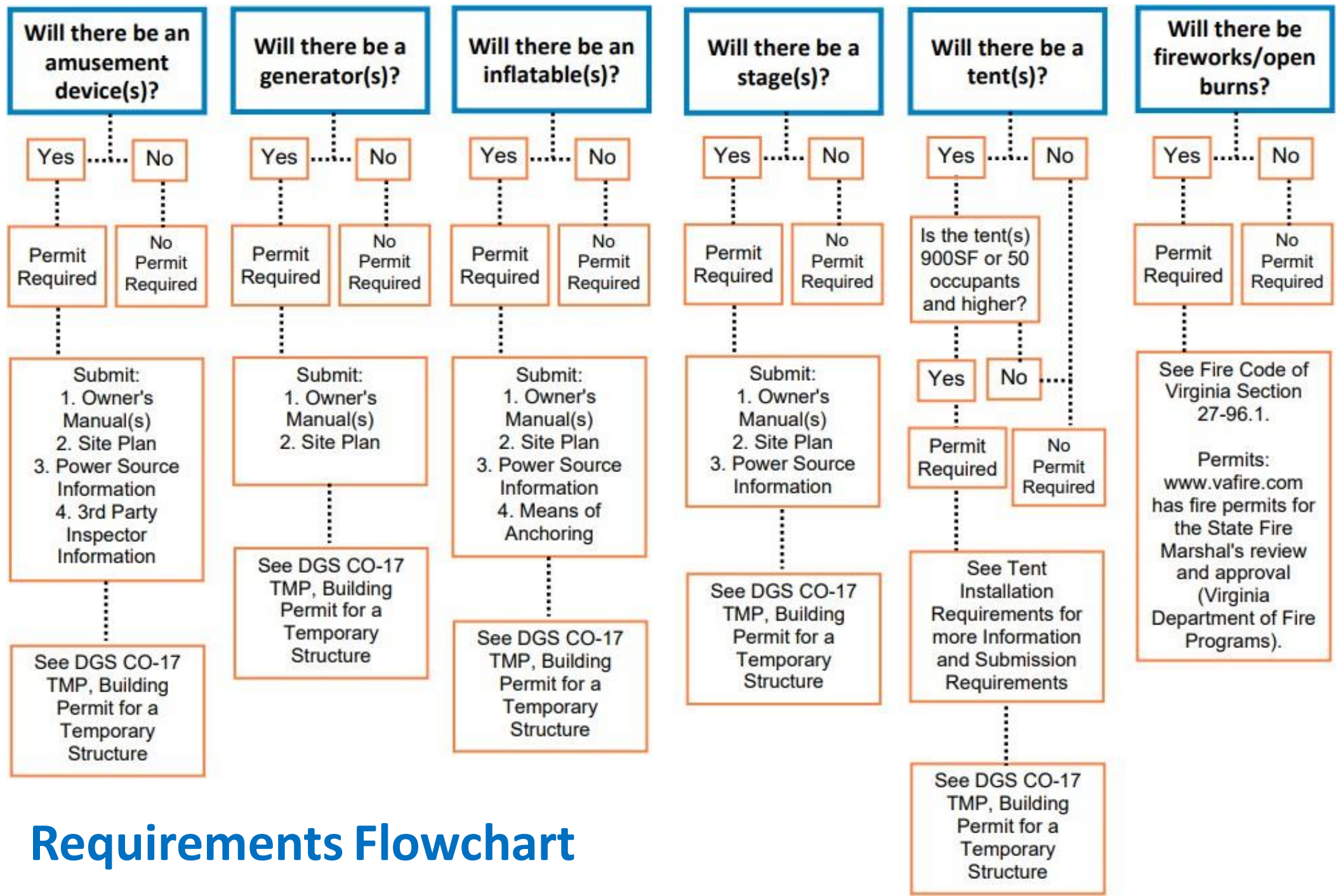

Grant Funded by the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation

Restoration of +/- 1000 LF of Fleets Branch

- Regrade stream bed to slow water flow (creates a meandering channel)
- Reinforce Banks
- Remove Debris/Invasives

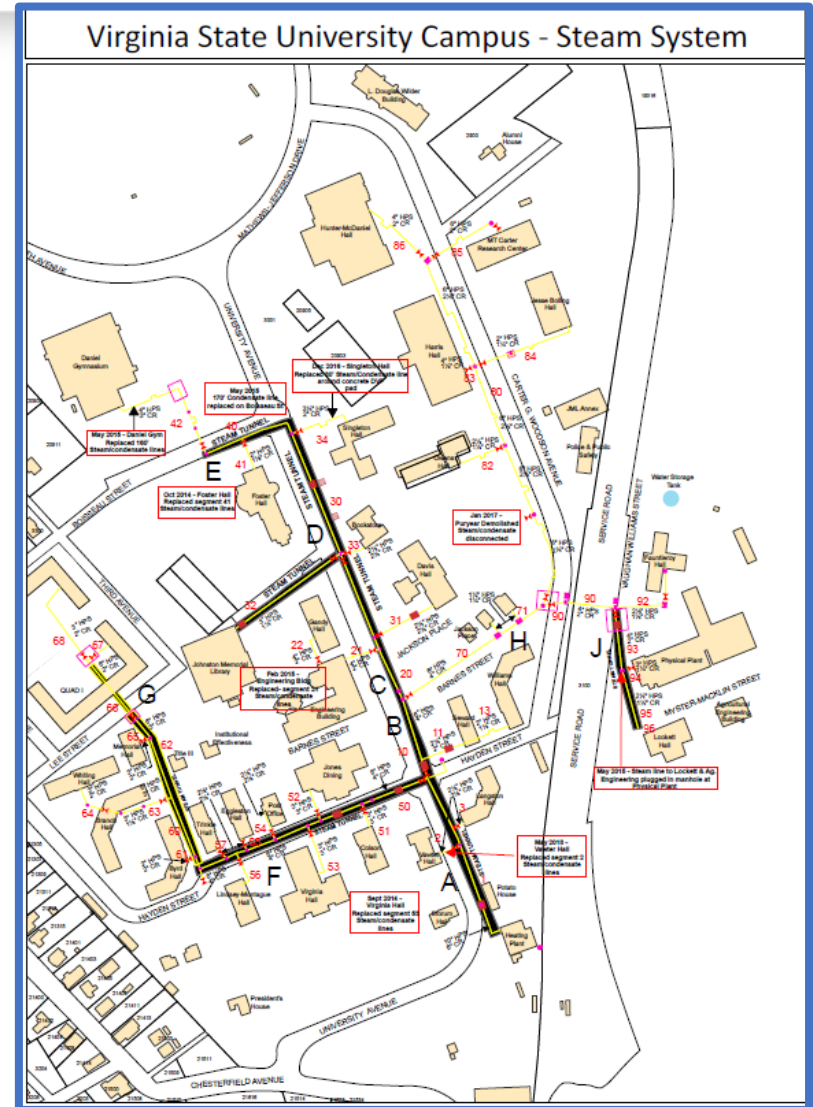

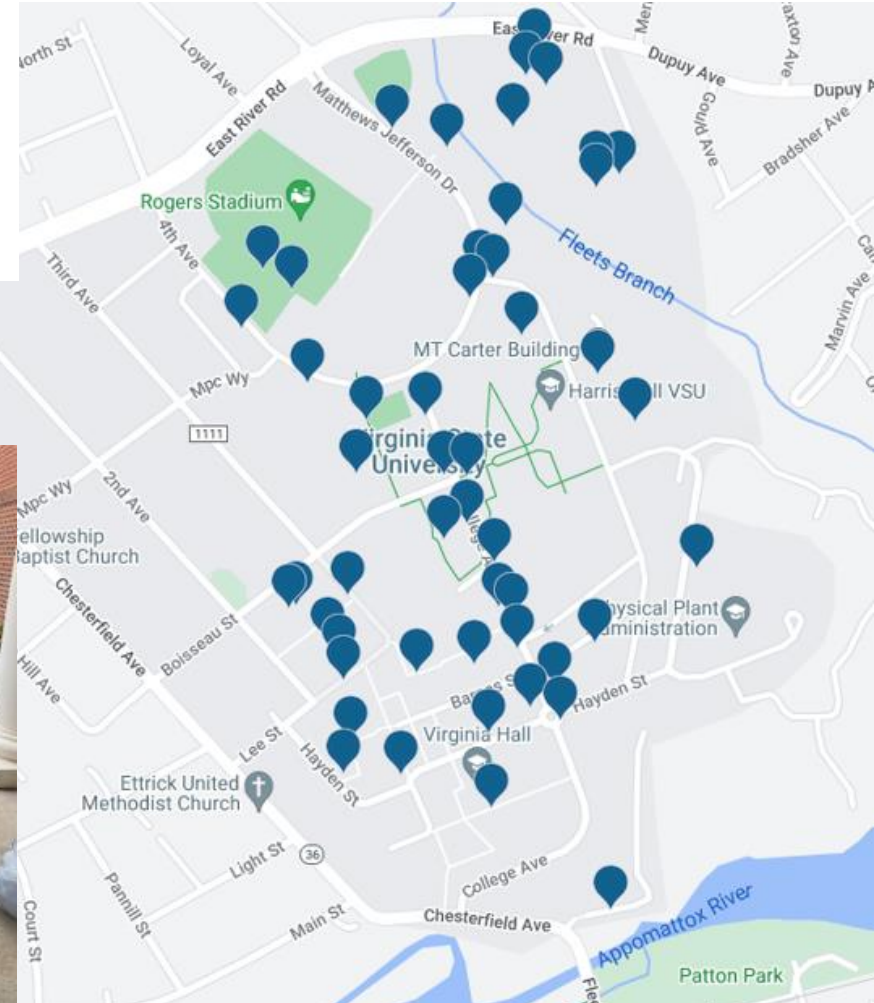

# Hazardous Waste Procedures

- Drums and containers should be properly labelled
- Stored in designated areas on campus- 6 months maximum storage time (includes expired chemicals)
- Call Facilities to assist with the coordination of the pickup
- Department that generates the waste will incur the cost of disposal



# Indoor Air Quality Concerns

- Asbestos, Lead-Based paint and mold
- Asbestos and Lead-Based paint projects will be coordinated through facilities.
- Mold Complaints- response may include a visual inspection, cleaning, remediation or sampling.

## Campus Grounds

### Current Work:

- Finished mulching the entire campus in late March/early April
- Applying granular and chemical pre/post emergent to minimize the growth of weeds
- Weekly Mowing of the entire campus
- Trimming hedges and trees as needed around the entire campus



## Athletic Grounds

### Current Work:

- Keeping the athletic fields in game ready shape for Baseball/Softball/Lacrosse etc.
- Weekly mowing and dragging of athletic fields.
- Applied granular pre-emergent to help prevent the growth of weeds
- Sweep/Groom the artificial turf football field about every 40 hours of use or once a month if there isn't much use on the field.





## Campus Grounds

### Future Work:

- Planting the seasonal flowers for Spring/Summer in late April/early May and will do the same for the Fall/Winter.
- Continue with weekly mowing of the entire campus.
- Trim Bushes, hedges and trees as needed throughout the summer and fall months.





## Athletic Grounds

### Future Work:

- Keep all athletic fields in game ready shape and irrigated in preparation for Fall sports (Football, Soccer, Lacrosse etc.)
- Apply granular and liquid herbicides/fertilizers to ensure the athletic fields have clean turf.
